- Knowledge of trauma-informed practice and the impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences
- Knowledge of appropriate interventions for supporting children with SEMH difficulties

- An ability to show empathy to all members of the school community.
- An ability to evidence a highly developed sense of self awareness and not respond personally to challenging situations.
- Confidence in conflict resolution with children and adults.
- An ability to contribute to Individual Inclusion Plans using specialist advice and knowledge of the child.
- Knowledge of appropriate and relevant legislation, including Keeping Children Safe in Education and Working Together to Safeguard Children 2023.
- A flexible approach to work
- Good time keeping
- Good organisational skills and effective recording.
- A warm, non-judgemental approach.
- An ability to act with integrity at all times
