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Our Local Area

Innsworth is a suburb of Gloucester, it is a civil parish and forms part of the borough of Tewkesbury. The community includes the Imjin Barracks which is home to the AARC.

Innsworth has excellent public transport links with regular bus services to Gloucester and Cheltenham. Both Gloucester and Cheltenham have railway stations with direct links to London, Birmingham, Bristol and Cardiff, and the M5 junction 11 and 11a are both within 2 miles.

Gloucestershire is a beautiful county with many opportunities for outdoor pursuits. The Forest of Dean, the River Severn and the Cotswolds are a short distance away and the Brecons are an easy drive.

There are theatres in Cheltenham, Gloucester and Tewkesbury as well as nearby Malvern and Stratford-upon-Avon. Cheltenham hosts several highly acclaimed festivals each year including Jazz, Music, Science and Literature and, of course, horse racing.
