Job Purpose:

To support the learning of students, by implementing a range of agreed strategies and interventions in small groups, one to one, or in a classroom setting.

Main Responsibilities:

- To plan and deliver targeted interventions, e.g. literacy, numeracy, social skills
- To be actively involved in the support and monitoring of student progress by:
 - a. Raising the level of academic achievement of targeted groups of students e.g. those from vulnerable backgrounds.
 - b. Devise and implement strategies to raise the academic achievement of students
 - c. Monitor the progress of students towards their academic targets and help students to achieve this
 - d. To be actively involved in mentoring students
 - e. To support identified students with focused literacy, numeracy and social skills programmes
- Responsible for checking and monitoring of attendance to targeted interventions
- To monitor the attendance of vulnerable students
- Work with the staff team to develop and promote strategies to raise self-esteem, and promote emotional regulation

- To maintain appropriate records to help monitor outcomes
- To produce a half termly summary of pupil progress
- Undertaking CPD and further research as required to expand own knowledge and skills base
- To apply the provision's behaviour management policy and report any difficulties
- These responsibilities might be carried out in some of the following ways:
 - a. Liaising with teaching staff to support teaching and learning
 - b. Working with parents
 - c. Induction of new pupils
 - d. Working with students on a 1:1, 2:1 or small group basis
 - e. Working across a range of settings, on and off site

Undertake any other similar duties as may from time to time be required by the Assistant Principal with responsibility for the Post 16 Centre.
