JOB PURPOSE

To support the classroom teacher with their responsibility for the development and education of children, including those with special physical, emotional and educational needs, by utilising detailed knowledge and specialist skills.

To promote independence, self-esteem and social inclusion.

Duties and responsibilities

All of the tasks and responsibilities for Grade 3 and in addition to those:

- Demonstrate an informed and efficient approach to teaching and learning by adopting relevant strategies to support the work of the teacher and increase achievement of all pupils including, where appropriate, those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)
- >Promote, support and facilitate inclusion by encouraging participation of all pupils in learning and extracurricular activities
- > Use effective behaviour management strategies consistently in line with the school's policy and procedures
- >Support class teachers with maintaining good order and discipline among pupils, managing behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment
- To manage the class to cover teacher's PPA/absence
- >Organise and manage teaching space and resources to help maintain a stimulating and safe learning environment
- Observe pupil performance and pass observations on to the class teacher
- To oversea individual classes or groups within the school, being responsible for cover supervision under the direction of the teacher.
- Use ICT skills to advance pupils' learning
- To contribute to effective planning and assessment by supporting the monitoring, recording and reporting of pupil progress as appropriate
- Communicate effectively with staff, pupils and parents and carers under the direction of the class teacher
- Develop effective, professional relationships with colleagues
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- > Promote the safety and wellbeing of pupils and to help safeguard pupils well being by following the requirements of Keeping Children Safe In education and our school's child protection policy
- > Keep their own knowledge and understanding relevant and up-to-date by reflecting on their own practice, liaising with school leaders and identifying any professional development which will improve their effectiveness in this role.
