The Design and Technology Department

We are a highly successful department with excellent exam results year on year. Design and Technology is a popular subject and our students thoroughly enjoy practical work which we put a strong emphasis on across the key stages. We operate in a carousel in KS3 where students in years 7, 8 and 9 have 4 hour long lessons a fortnight. It remains a very popular option choice at GCSE and we currently have 4 groups each in years 10 and 11 specialising in either Graphics or Materials. We offer AQA A level Product Design, which is popular with students from both a graphics and materials background.

Lytchett Minster School is well equipped to meet the curriculum demands in Design and Technology. Our facilities include three Materials workshops, a fully equipped technician's store, two Graphics rooms and three Food Technology rooms. We have excellent ICT resources along with two laser cutters and a 3D printer. Facilities expanded further recently to meet the growth of the school.

The Design and Technology Faculty currently comprises six full time and two part-time teachers. There are five Material/Graphics and three Food Technology teachers. The Faculty teaches students from the full ability range from Years seven to thirteen. The teachers are well supported by two excellent Technicians. This success relies very much on the teamwork, co-operation and commitment of staff to focus on students as individuals.

At Key Stage 3, all students are taught in mixed ability groups and study a foundation course that closely prepares students for Key Stage 4, where students study Edexcel Design and Technology options in Materials, Graphic Products and AQA Food Preparation and Nutrition. Results in all three areas have been consistently excellent. The Faculty also offers WJEC level 3 Diploma in Food Science and Nutrition and Product Design at A Level.

The department contributes strongly to the extracurricular life of the school and students attend after school clubs in the department most nights.

We are looking for a knowledgeable Graphics and Product Design specialist who will inspire students, of all ages and abilities, to enjoy and understand Design and Technology. The successful candidate will act as the Key Stage

3 Co-ordinator and will work alongside a dedicated, friendly and highly supportive team, all of whom are committed to both the timeless aspects of good teaching and a willingness to explore new directions. The dominant ethos of the department is one of team work and co-operation. Schemes of work are provided for all year groups but also allow a degree of flexibility: colleagues are welcome to adapt and change these to incorporate their own ideas.
