### **Key Responsibilities**

Working closely with other faculty leaders for KS3 the D&T Co-ordinator will be responsible for:

- Management of the KS3 D&T curriculum (to include management of the smooth running of the KS3 carousel)
- Co-ordination of KS3 D&T scheme of work
- Quality Assurance of KS3 teaching and learning
- Tracking the progress of students across KS3 in the D&T Curriculum

#### A. Development of the subject

Within the context of the key responsibilities above and working closely with the Head of Department the Co-ordinator will:

- develop policies and practices which reflect the Faculty's commitment to high achievement and effective teaching and learning;
- promote positive attitudes towards the subject and confidence in teaching it;
- use a range of data to identify individual pupil targets, monitor progress and develop strategies to support staff in achieving them.

### B. Teaching and Learning

- provide advice on appropriate teaching and learning materials;
- monitor pupil progress through review of school data.

## C. Leading and Managing Staff

Within the context of the key responsibilities above and working closely with the Head of Department the Co-ordinator will:

- contribute support to subject colleagues;
- contribute to professional development activities to support teaching;
- contribute to the programme of support for early career teachers (ECTs) in the department and new colleagues.

## D. Effective and efficient deployment of staff and resources

Within the context of the key responsibilities above and working closely with the Head of Department the Co-ordinator will:

- advise the Head of Faculty on resource needs;
- maintain existing resources;
- promote effective and stimulating displays in the faculty.
