- Will lead teachers, in collaboration with SLT, ensuring the highest quality, academically rigorous, challenging lessons are delivered
- Work with SLT in the monitoring and supporting of the overall progress and development of students in the department
- Facilitate and encourage a learning experience which provides students with the opportunity to achieve their individual potential
- Contribute to raising standards of student attainment
- Will share and support the school's responsibility to provide and monitor opportunities for personal and academic growth
- Present regularly to SLT on their findings and next steps for their remit
- To lead departmental CPD, planned in collaboration with SLT
