#### **Strategic Direction**

Under the direction of The Director of Mathematics:

- Develop and implement policies and practices for Mathematics which reflect our school's commitment to high achievement, effective teaching and learning
- Create a climate which enables staff to develop and maintain positive attitudes towards the subject and confidence in teaching it.
- Establish a clear, shared understanding of the importance and role of the subject in contributing to pupils' spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development, and in preparing pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult life
- Use data driven improvement, line management and coaching effectively to identify pupils who
  are underachieving in the subject and create and implement effective plans for Mathematics to
  support those pupils where necessary
- Work with the Director or Mathematics to analyse and interpret relevant national, local and school data as well as research and inspection evidence, to inform policies, practices, expectations, targets and teaching methods
- With the involvement of relevant staff and under the leadership of The Director of Mathematics, establish short, medium and long term plans for the development and resourcing of the subject and reading
- Support the Director of Mathematics in creating the DSEF and DDPs
- Monitor the progress made in achieving targets, evaluate the effects on teaching and learning, and use this analysis to guide further improvement
- Planning, monitoring and evaluating departmental CPD

#### **Teaching and Learning**

Under the direction of the Director of Mathematics:

- Contribute to the curriculum plans ensuring clarity on intention, implementation and impact
- Ensure curriculum coverage, continuity and progression in the subject for all pupils, including more able pupils, pupils with special educational needs and pupils with English as an additional language
- Support The Director of Mathematics to make sure that teachers are clear about the teaching objectives in lessons, understand the sequence of teaching and learning in the subject, and communicate such information to pupils
- Provide guidance on the choice of appropriate teaching and learning methods to meet the needs of the subject and of different pupils.
- Ensure effective development of pupils' literacy and numeracy skills.
- Establish and implement clear policies and practices for assessing, recording and reporting on pupil achievement, and for using this information to recognise achievement, set targets, and secure good progress.
- Evaluate the teaching and use this analysis to identify effective practice and areas for improvement, and take action to improve further the quality of teaching.



#### **Leading and Managing Staff**

With the support of the Director of Mathematics:

- Help staff to achieve constructive working relationships with pupils and parents
- Establish clear expectations and constructive working relationships among staff involved with the subject, including through team working and mutual support; devolving responsibilities and delegating tasks, as appropriate
- Sustain your own motivation and, where possible, that of other staff involved in the subject
- Appraise staff as required by the school policy and use the process to develop the personal and professional effectiveness of the appraisee(s)
- Lead professional development of subject staff through example and support, and co-ordinate
  the provision of high-quality professional development by methods such as coaching, drawing on
  other sources of expertise as necessary, for example, higher education, local authority, subject
  associations
- Enable teachers to achieve expertise in their subject teaching
- Work with the SENCO and any other staff with special educational needs expertise, to make sure that education, health and care plans are used to set subject-specific targets and match work well to pupils' needs.

- Ensure there is a clear assessment plan.
