- To facilitate and encourage a learning experience which provides students with the opportunity to achieve their individual potential.
- To contribute to raising standards of student attainment.

- Supporting the department by leading on pedagogy within the department, contributing to meetings, and helping to resource the curriculum.

The Recruitment Process

1. Application

The completed online application form should be accompanied by a personal statement of suitability of no more than 2 sides of A4. Please include specific examples which support your application.

Applications must be received no later than 8 January 2024. Applications received after this date and time will not be considered.

2. Shortlisting

Shortlisting will be finalised by 10 January 2024. Shortlisted applicants will be invited by telephone to attend an interview. Please make sure you have indicated clearly day and evening telephone numbers on which you can be reached. References will be taken up after shortlisting.

3. Interview Process

Interviews will be held w/c 15 January 2024. Applicants will also be asked to undertake a practical test related to the knowledge and abilities in the Person Specification.

4. Feedback

Unsuccessful shortlisted applicants will have the opportunity for professional feedback during the week following the interviews.
