As lead teacher, the successful candidate will help the department's leadership with the CPD delivery for the team, in particular by planning and delivering training sessions and observing and providing feedback to colleagues. They will hold Qualified Teacher Status (QTS), have a proven track record of successful Mathematics teaching across different key stages and believe that all students can succeed in these courses.

Main Duties & Responsibilities

To work with the Head of Learning Area to ensure the effective provision of Mathematics teaching and learning throughout the key stage and to take on an active role in leading within the department. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Promoting and being committed to the Academy's aims and objectives and to implement Academy policies.
- To work with the Head of Learning Area to ensure the effective provision of teaching and learning in Maths
