Orchard View Primary Academy is a brand-new academy, offering a unique opportunity to be part of something special from the very beginning. Built on strong values, high expectations and an unwavering belief in the potential of every learner, Orchard View is committed to inclusive, high-quality education for all.

Orchard View opened in September 2025 with 60 pupils across Foundation Stage and a mixed Year 1/Year 2 class and is currently operating from Kingsbrook View Primary Academy, a partner school within the Inspiring Futures Partnership Trust. From September 2026, Orchard View will move into a state-of-the-art new building and expand to a capacity of 180 pupils across Foundation Stage, Years 1, 2 and 3.

As the academy grows, we are opening **The Glade**, our specialist **Social, Emotional & Mental Health Additionally Resourced Centre (SEMH ARC)**, designed to provide a nurturing, structured and therapeutic environment for pupils with social, emotional and mental health needs. The provision will support pupils to re-engage with learning while developing emotional regulation, resilience and positive relationships.

This role is ideally suited to an experienced teacher with a strong understanding of SEMH needs and inclusive practice, who is passionate about relational approaches, behaviour as communication and trauma-informed strategies. The successful candidate will be confident in leading a specialist provision, modelling high-quality practice, and working collaboratively with the SENDco, senior leaders, families and external professionals to secure positive outcomes for pupils.

This is a rare opportunity to shape and lead a new SEMH provision from its inception, within a values-driven and supportive academy that believes in the power of education to transform lives.

Purpose of the Role

To lead and deliver high-quality, inclusive teaching within **The Glade**, the academy's SEMH ARC, enabling pupils with social, emotional and mental health needs to re-engage with learning and achieve positive academic, social and emotional outcomes.

The Lead Teacher will take responsibility for the day-to-day operational leadership of the SEMH ARC, modelling best practice, promoting positive behaviour, and supporting pupils' wellbeing, attendance and readiness to learn. The role carries shared responsibility for safeguarding, inclusion and the development of a nurturing, structured and therapeutic environment.

The postholder will treat pupils and colleagues with dignity, build strong relationships rooted in trust and respect, and consistently model professional boundaries appropriate to a teacher's role. This Job Description should be read alongside the Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document and the Teacher Standards.

Main Duties

Set High Expectations

- Be a positive role model, demonstrating consistently high expectations for behaviour, relationships and learning within a specialist SEMH setting
- Establish a calm, predictable and safe environment that supports pupils' emotional regulation and engagement

Promote Good Progress and Outcomes

- Take responsibility for the learning, wellbeing, behaviour and progress of pupils within the SEMH ARC
- Be accountable for pupils' academic progress, emotional development and successful reintegration into mainstream provision where appropriate
- Promote independence, resilience and self-regulation, embedding the academy's values and inclusive ethos into daily practice

Demonstrate Strong Curriculum and SEMH Knowledge

- Deliver a curriculum that balances academic learning with targeted SEMH, therapeutic and developmental support
- Relate learning to real-life experiences, supporting pupils to make sense of their learning and behaviour
- Maintain up-to-date knowledge of SEMH, trauma-informed practice and behaviour as communication
- Take responsibility for ongoing professional development and contribute to the development of SEMH practice across the academy

Plan and Teach Well-Structured Sessions

- Plan and deliver flexible, well-structured learning experiences tailored to pupils' emotional and developmental needs
- Use a range of strategies to engage pupils, including regulation strategies, adaptive teaching, outdoor learning and practical approaches

- Set clear learning and wellbeing objectives, adapting plans responsively based on pupils' presentation and readiness to learn
- Evaluate and refine practice to continually improve outcomes for pupils
- Make effective use of ICT, specialist resources and learning environments, including outdoor spaces

Adapt Teaching to Meet Individual Needs

- Ensure teaching is highly personalised, with appropriate differentiation, challenge and emotional support
- Have a clear understanding of pupils' SEND, SEMH profiles, trauma histories and individual triggers
- Take responsibility for pupils with EHCPs, contributing to and reviewing targets and provision maps in partnership with the SENDco
- Support accelerated progress for disadvantaged pupils and those at risk of disengagement

Make Accurate and Purposeful Use of Assessment

- Use assessment to track academic progress, emotional development and readiness for learning
- Set clear, aspirational but realistic targets, celebrating progress in small steps
- Provide regular, meaningful feedback to pupils that supports confidence, reflection and growth
- Use assessment information and data systems to inform planning, interventions and reintegration decisions

Manage Behaviour Effectively

- Lead on behaviour practice within The Glade, using consistent, relational and trauma-informed approaches
- Support pupils to develop emotional regulation and positive coping strategies
- Work proactively with parents/carers to support behaviour, attendance and engagement
- Develop, implement and review behaviour and support plans in partnership with the SENDco and external professionals

Fulfil Wider Professional Responsibilities

- Provide leadership within the SEMH ARC, supporting and guiding support staff and ensuring consistency of practice
- Work closely with senior leaders, the SENDco, mainstream teachers and external agencies to support pupil outcomes
- Contribute to academy and Trust meetings, systems and professional learning
- Support reintegration planning and transitions for pupils
- Contribute positively to the wider life and ethos of the academy and Trust

Personal and Professional Conduct

- Liaise with external agencies to support pupils' welfare and wellbeing
- Safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people, following academy procedures
- Model professional conduct, reliability and reflective practice at all times
- Meet deadlines, communicate effectively and contribute positively to a collaborative team culture
