Our SMSC programme is a real strength of the school.

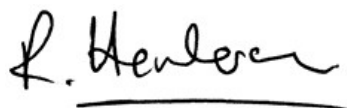

Information about the SEND Department

Northfield School has a team of 17 staff who support approximately 204 pupils who have Special Educational Needs. We are committed to promoting an inclusive approach to education, which involves creating an ethos of achievement within a climate of high expectations.

This is achieved by:

- providing classroom support to the pupils and subject teacher;
- delivering planned interventions;
- providing a range of resources to support the pupil both within and outside the classroom;
- supporting activities during social times to promote inclusion and provide safe spaces;
- promoting a 'Growth Mind Set';
- encouraging independent learning, at a pace that is comfortable for the pupil;
- promoting self-awareness, social and personal relationships;
- supporting pupils with homework;
- liaising with teachers and other professionals involved with the pupil;
- offering a breakfast club for identified pupils;
- accessing training to support understanding of pupil needs and the curriculum.
