Able to work towards Vocational Qualifications Level 2 or have specialist skills in a relevant field.  Working knowledge of relevant skill set, systems, equipment, processes and procedures.  Competent in a range of IT tools.  May be required to undertake manual handling and physically demanding work.  Ability to apply relevant health and safety, equality and diversity, and other School policies and procedures.  Ability to work with others to provide excellent customer service  Ability to communicate clearly.  Accuracy and ability to prioritise and organise own workload.  Specific training in medical procedures, required to support individual needs of pupil.
Role Summary	Roles at this level carry out a range of duties to given standards under some supervision. This may include overseeing an activity and/or use of powered tools and equipment. They will be expected to be able to plan and organise their own workload and /or activity on a day-to-day basis within clear procedures. They will need to understand the objectives of lessons/interventions sufficiently to allow them to support the work of others effectively. Entry to this level may be through some relevant work experience or specialist skills.

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
