

CLASS TEACHER JOB DESCRIPTION (Main Scale 1-6)

The post holder is expected to carry out the professional duties of a qualified teacher in accordance with the current DFE Teachers' Pay and Conditions document and those described in the Outcomes.

This job description should be read with the Teachers' Standards in England.

Job Purpose:

The Class Teacher will:

- teach a class of pupils, and ensure that planning, preparation, recording, assessment and reporting meet their varying learning and social needs;
- maintain the positive ethos and core values of the school, both inside and outside the classroom;
- contribute to constructive team-building amongst teaching and non-teaching staff, parents and governors;
- have a working knowledge of:
- the national conditions of employment for school teachers as set out in the current copy of the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document;
- the national standards for Qualified Teacher Status.

Duties:

The Class Teacher will:

- implement agreed school policies and guidelines;
- support initiatives decided by the Headteacher and staff;
- plan appropriately to meet the needs of all pupils, through differentiation of tasks;
- be able to set clear targets, based on prior attainment, for pupils' learning;
- provide a stimulating classroom environment, where resources can be accessed appropriately by all pupils;
- keep appropriate and efficient records, integrating formative and summative assessment into weekly and termly planning;
- report to parents on the development, progress and attainment of pupils;
- maintain good order and discipline amongst pupils, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy;
- take part in and contribute to meetings that relate to teaching/curriculum; cooperate with and, where appropriate, advise the head teacher and other colleagues in the review, development and management of subjects

- communicate and co-operate with specialists from outside agencies;
- plan for, organise and direct the work of support staff within the classroom;
- participate in the performance management system for the appraisal of their own performance, or that of other teachers;
- Take a lead on subject area
