

CLASS TEACHER JOB DESCRIPTION

The following responsibilities set out below and in the context of the school in no way diminish the importance of the Conditions of Employment of the above Order. All teachers are expected to follow the teachers' standards.

- To be prepared to teach pupils of Primary School ages (including Nursery Years 3 11).
- To be responsible for planning and delivering the National Curriculum and IPC.
- To have been judged as a good teacher or better by appraisal, moderation or tutor.
- To prepare lessons and materials, mark work and keep records of children's achievements as required by the National Curriculum, SACRE and the school's SIMS system.
- To maintain a safe, well organised class area, with displays of children's work and teaching aids and to contribute to maintaining a lively and stimulating school environment.
- To administer tests which the DfE, the LA or the school may require.
- To liaise with parents, attend formal termly parent consultation evenings and to discuss pupil achievements and next steps required for their further development with their parents.
- To attend staff meetings and other training as required.
- To write reports on children as required by external agencies e.g. The Health Authority, Social Services.
- To carry out other duties as shall reasonably be required by the Headteacher.
- To uphold the UNICEF Rights Respecting ethos of the school, with safeguarding and well-being at it's centre.
- To accept responsibility for your professional development through in-service training, appraisal and reading.
