Main purpose of the role

- To provide administrative and clerical support services to a high standard, supporting management, other office staff, teachers, students and parents in an efficient, positive, professional and effective manner.
- To work within a team, leading on specific areas of responsibility as directed by the Outreach Coordinator
- To provide flexibility to enable the Maths Hub, East Maths Community and Outreach programmes to run effectively and efficiently.

Organisational relationships

- Responsible to the Outreach Coordinator
- Direct liaison with a range of stakeholders including Maths Hub Leads, East Maths Community Advocate teachers, UEA staff, visitors, governors and other Inspiration Trust staff.

Principal accountabilities and responsibilities

Core Duties	• To undertake general administrative tasks such as photocopying, laminating, filing, scanning, word processing/typing, mail merge, computing and information/data services, ensuring functions efficiently meet the needs of the Maths Hub, East Maths Community and Outreach programmes. • To offer a professional and courteous service to all stakeholders, ensuring all visitors are made to feel welcome and provide hospitality as required. • Supporting Maths Hub Leads, and East Maths Community Leads and Teachers as required within the scope of an admin role. • To support the online delivery of Maths Hub CPD and Outreach sessions, including setup of meetings, breakout rooms and attendance. • To provide administrative support to the Maths Outreach Lead, Maths Hub Leads and the Central Maths Team when required. • To prepare outgoing post and take it to the Post Office, as required. • To check and distribute orders as appropriate and assist with ordering/storage of supplies. • To undertake any other duties of an administrative nature and any other duties that are within the scope of the post as determined by the Outreach Coordinator and Leadership Team.
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Organisation	• To proactively support the planning, organising and hosting of events, and providing general assistance with general correspondence and invitations. • To assist with data and the inputting of information as required.
Communication	• To assist with the preparation and distribution of communications. • To respond promptly to any telephone or other messages, and to deal with as appropriate, assisting with any routine queries.
Finance	• To support finance administration as required, including but not limited to courses and events.
Recording data	• To assist with the preparation of forms, maintenance of records/registers.
