JOB PURPOSE:

To supervise all children on the school premises to ensure that health and safety, and school regulations are observed.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

- Supervision of children in all areas of the school, including dining hall, play areas, classroom, and playground as directed by the Early Years Lead, Headteacher, and/or Deputy Headteacher.
- The maintenance of good order at all times. Relay relevant information of individual or group behaviour to either the Early Years Lead, Headteacher, or Deputy Headteacher. Not all incidents on Smartlog and CPOMS where necessary.
- Supervision of children during the meal, encouraging good eating habits, assisting younger children where necessary and ensuring that a good atmosphere is maintained.
- Managing and handling difficult behaviour from children.
- General assistance in the dining area as necessary, e.g. setting up tables and putting away, floor cleaning, wiping up spillages.
- Supervision of movement of pupils ensuring that good order is maintained.
- Keep up to date with the special medical requirements of individual children as listed.
- Any other duties as may be delegated by the Headteacher.
