ASPIRE

A VALUES-LED ACADEMY TRUST

Aspire provides an outstanding alternative education provision and support for secondary aged students. Students attend full or part time and are referred to us by schools and the Local Authority.

Our focus is to support young people, together with their families and schools, to reach beyond their potential and enable them to flourish by developing positive behaviours, attitudes and aspirations.

We run a range of different types of provision across Buckinghamshire. We have three AP schools, which cater for permanently excluded students as well as those at risk of exclusion, on 12-week placements. We also have a nurture school for students with EHCPs for SEMH, a hospital school and a medical needs and home tuition service which provides education for children who cannot access their usual school for medical reasons.

BLUEPRINT

A PURPOSE-BUILT SECONDARY AP SCHOOL

Blueprint is a purpose-built Alternative Provision school in Aylesbury. We take secondary students who have been permanently excluded, and offer placements to those who are at risk of exclusion. Increasingly, we are also finding ourselves supporting students with complex needs and EHCPs for SEMH while appropriate specialist settings can be found.

We offer a wide curriculum, including a core academic offer of English, Maths, Science, Art and Humanities GCSEs, and also have a number of dedicated vocational spaces for Motor Vehicle Study, Construction, Music, Cooking, and Hair and Beauty.





CHILTERN SKILLS AND ENTERPRISE CENTRE

A PURPOSE-BUILT VOCATIONAL AND ACADEMIC EDUCATIONAL CENTRE

CSEC was built as a vocational education centre in Chesham, Buckinghamshire. We have amazing classroom spaces for a wide range of vocational subjects, including mechanics, motor vehicle studies, construction, hair and beauty, catering, music, enterprise and horticulture. We have also got a number of classrooms for traditional academic subjects, such as Maths, English, Science and Humanities.

Our students come from across Buckinghamshire. We take permanently excluded students, and run a number of preventative programmes which involve students coming to us for placements. We also do outreach work with local schools.

WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

We are looking for an experienced Teacher of Mathematics who demonstrates the aptitude and passion to become the subject specialist across our Buckinghamshire sites. You will possess the vision and commitment to engage students who may not yet have discovered a love for the subject.

We seek to employ teachers who believe that young people who have been excluded need to be in a nurturing and loving environment, to feel valued and cared for, and to have teachers who believe in them. We know this work isn't always easy. You need to be calm in the face of challenging behaviour, to always see the best in a young person, and to find something to love in them, no matter what.

We have high expectations of our young people, in terms of their behaviour, social development, and academic achievement. We know that young people who have been excluded often have complex backgrounds, and/or a number of unmet special educational needs. When they receive the right support, they are capable of great things.

We offer Functional Skills and GCSE Mathematics as well as GCSE Statistics as an option. We are proud of our aspirational Mathematics curriculum, going far beyond what is studied in many AP Settings.

We are looking for someone who will help us raise standards even further, and who will love our students, and help them achieve extraordinary things.



A MESSAGE FROM DEBRA RUTLEY, CEO


Debra Rutley has led Aspire since 2012, during which time it has been rated Outstanding by Ofsted four consecutive times. Debra is also a National Leader of Education.
