Purpose	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To plan and deliver the music curriculum at Greenways, including instructing pupils in practical methods and theory of general music, singing and playing in musical instruments. • To lead the school choir and other music related activities. • To provide specialist tuition to individuals, groups and whole classes as a subject expert. • To safeguard and promote the welfare of all pupils and young people, and follow school policies and the staff code of conduct.
Job context	This role involves working as part of the teaching and learning team at Greenways Primary School, focusing specifically on the development of music, and the enrichment and social opportunities it provides.
Responsibilities: Teaching and Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plan and teach well-structured, high-quality lessons to assigned classes, groups and individuals following the school's plans, curriculum and schemes of work. • Review the curriculum for music regularly, to ensure that it remains up-to-date and suitable for the needs of all pupils. • Plan lessons with clear learning objectives, considering how they will be taught. • Assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievements of assigned pupils, making accurate and productive use of assessment. • Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of pupils. • Set high expectations for learning and behaviour which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils to achieve their best. • Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge • Lead singing assemblies
