All children access our Forest School provision and this is a popular addition to their curriculum, with Beach School soon to start in Spring. We also believe that our children need to be given the opportunity to travel further afield to experience life outside of Cornwall. Such opportunities can be seen with children travelling to destinations such as Bristol and London as part of their learning of the world around them.
