



JOB DESCRIPTION Nurture Practitioner (Primary)

Responsible to: Team Leader

Grade: G6 Pt 8 – 13 £19,469 to £21,325

Hours: 37 Hours per week, Term Time only plus 5 days per annum

1.2 Main Purpose of Job

- To assist in planning, organising, managing and delivering structured learning activities
- To create a safe, structured, stimulating, positive learning environment within the curriculum or subject area being taught.
 - To support student's learning and positive learning behaviour in lessons
 - To support student's learning and positive behaviour in breaks and activity times
 - To provide individual support and 1:1 interventions where identified
 - To play a key part in the planning and delivery of individual student programmes and to contribute to other extended curriculum activities.
 - To fully contribute to the staff team's and Meadowbrook's collective responsibility to secure outstanding outcomes for all students
 - To follow Meadowbrook College procedures in safeguarding and child protection
 - To be a key worker for a small number of students and be the link between home and school for these students

1.3 Main Duties

With students:

- To act as a positive role model, maintaining the highest professional and personal standards, in order to encourage positive behaviour and thinking in all students.
- To work alongside teachers and other staff to support student learning during lessons and activity sessions.
- To supervise the work being undertaken by individual or small groups of students, some of whom
 might be deemed to be at risk and may have challenging behaviour.
- To supervise students from arrival to leaving, through all break times.
- To deliver elements of the core curriculum under the guidance of teaching staff.
- To take joint responsibility, with identified lead staff, the planning, delivery and evaluation of extension curriculum sessions
- To support strategies to maintain high attendance for the students and take action when non-attendance occurs.
- To take part in supporting students during off-site activities, visits and trips including outdoor pursuits/residential education opportunities.
- To ensure that all people involved in any session are supervised and safe.
- To assist in all student assessments, reviews and reporting.
- To promote an effective 'learning partnership' between students, parents/carers and Meadowbrook College by undertaking direct and regular liaison with parents/carers.
- To be committed to safeguarding, child protection and promoting the welfare of children and young people by following Oxfordshire County Council & Meadowbrook College procedures for safeguarding and child protection.

With parents:

- To be the main link between home and school for a small group of key students
- To complete home visits, as appropriate, to discuss and review student's progress

As a professional Meadowbrook Team member:

- To actively promote Meadowbrook restorative principles and practices.
- To attend all staff meeting/briefings, training sessions and other meetings as necessary.
- To fulfil all health and safety responsibilities as identified in Meadowbrook H&S Policy.
- To participate in the Meadowbrook College Performance Appraisal Scheme for staff.
- To undertake relevant professional development and training where and when necessary
- To undertake any other duties commensurate with the post as directed by the Headteacher
