Overall purpose of job:

To deliver targeted intervention and support to identified students, on a one-to-one or small group basis, helping to raise attainment by identifying and addressing reasons for underperformance.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Plan and deliver intervention programmes to identified pupils in the specified subject area
- 2. Develop intervention material, which is broad, balanced, relevant and differentiated
- 3. Track the progress of students who you work with, identifying areas for development
- 4. Liaise with class teachers, Head of Department/Faculty and SLT regarding the progress of identified students
- 5. Facilitate and encourage an environment which supports students' learning and helps them achieve their potential
- 6. Support exam revision sessions as required
- 7. Attend faculty/departmental meetings as required
- 8. Develop positive working relationships with students, staff and parents and other contacts as required
