PURPOSE OF JOB:

Set high standards which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils

- establishing a safe and stimulating environment for pupils, rooted in mutual respect
- setting goals that stretch and challenge all pupils
- consistently demonstrating the positive attitudes, values and behaviour

Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils

- being accountable for pupils' attainment, progress and outcomes
- guiding pupils to reflect on the progress they have made and their emerging needs
- encouraging pupils to take a responsible and conscientious attitude to their own work and study

Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge

- having a secure knowledge of the curriculum
- fostering pupils' interest in a range of subjects and addressing misunderstandings
- · actively keep up to date with developments in curriculum areas
- promoting high standards of literacy, oracy and grammar
- demonstrating a clear understanding of systemic synthetic phonics, early reading, writing and mathematics

Plan and teach effectively

- making effective use of time, resources and a range of strategies
- promoting a love of learning and children's independence and curiosity
- setting homework and planning other out-of-class activities to consolidate and extend learning
- planning teaching to build on pupils' capabilities and prior knowledge
- contributing to planning an engaging curriculum

Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of all pupils

adapt teaching to support pupils learning at different stages of development, those
with special educational needs, of different ability; with EAL and with disabilities.

Make accurate and productive use of assessment

- making use of formative and summative assessment to secure pupils' progress
- using relevant data to monitor progress, set targets, and plan subsequent lessons
- giving pupils regular constructive feedback, both orally and through accurate marking and encouraging pupils to respond to feedback
- keeping records of progress and produce reports for parents

Manage behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment

- taking responsibility for promoting good behaviour in classrooms and around the school, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy
- having high expectations of behaviour, and use positive strategies, consistently and fairly
- · maintaining good relationships with pupils

Fulfil wider professional responsibilities

- making a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of our school
- developing effective professional relationships with colleagues
- deploying support staff effectively
