Thank you for your interest in this post. We are looking for a part-time (0.8) teacher of English to join us from September or November 2021 to cover maternity leave. Both start dates are possible.

The post from September to October half term will be the conclusion of a general maternity cover, including teaching Geography, Computing and PSHE to the younger year groups, with support from the respective teams.

From November, it will be an English post, teaching both Language and Literature at KS3 and KS4. English, therefore, is the main focus of the maternity cover. Both maternity covers will be 4 days a week.

We welcome innovative thinking and seek somebody to share our vision of English teaching. Our ideal candidate is an energetic, enthusiastic team player who is willing to help drive the department forwards with new ideas, resources and extra-curricular activities.

The AGS English Department will:

- · Empower students by developing advanced communication skills
- · Foster a lifelong love of words through literature and language study
- · Enable enquiring and critical engagement with others' ideas
- · Encourage a sense of cultural identity.

The department places a strong emphasis on teamwork. The successful applicant will be very well supported throughout their time here. This is an excellent opportunity to work in an outstanding academic environment with innovative and experienced colleagues and keen, well-motivated students.

The curriculum

All members of the department teach across the full age range. As a department we have developed robust and challenging Programmes of Study. There are comprehensive and well-resourced schemes of work in place. Any new member of the team will benefit from a cohesive and supportive network of experienced specialists. Nevertheless, successful applicants will need independence and resilience to manage change.

KS3 In Years 7-9 students study a range of challenging literary texts and language topics, based on both spoken and written English. Lessons are typically interactive with a strong emphasis on shared talk to develop a personal voice within the classroom.

KS4 All members of the department are expected to teach GCSE and take a full role in planning, teaching and assessment. Students follow the GCSE AQA English Language and AQA English Literature specifications. Our current GCSE course is extremely successful; we are constantly striving to further improve provision.

A level teaching is also central to the job: we teach AQA English Language and Edexcel English Literature. We have a very strong record of outstanding success. A significant number of our students go on to pursue English courses at University.

Most of us graduated with Literature qualifications and have acquired the skills to teach A level English Language "on the job". We are therefore experienced in supporting each other through collaborative teaching and planning.

We are particularly proud of our innovative A level teaching methods: we deliver a coursework programme based on Higher Education models of seminars and individual tutorials.
