Kesteven and Grantham Girls' School is a highly successful and oversubscribed 11-18 Selective Girls' Academy. The school is the sole school in the Kesteven and Grantham Girls' School Academy trust.

The school has between 175 and 187 students in each year group and each of these is then split into six form groups. Each form group belongs to one of the schools six houses – Austen, Rossetti, Potter, Browning, Bronte and Eliot. In the sixth form we have just over 300 students currently on roll, resulting in just over 1200 students in total.

KGGS is fantastic place to work. Students are enthusiastic, work hard, and are keen to do well whilst parents are extremely supportive of the school. Staff are dedicated and skilled practitioners with a vibrant mix of both experienced teachers and those newer to the profession.

Staff are encouraged to develop and embrace new ideas to ensure lessons continue to be engaging and appropriately challenging for our students with regular dedicated CPD time provided to all teaching staff. This allows staff to personalise their own development along with the use the latest educational research to help shape their own practice.

A member of the senior leadership team leads staff induction and training and we continue to invest in our staff development to ensure high quality lessons are regularly delivered to our students

As a school we actively work with our local teacher training providers with many of our own staff also completing part of their training with us. Each year we take on Early Career Teachers and ensure they make a successful start to their teaching careers.

Examination results have been consistently very strong with Progress 8 in 2023 being +1.04, Attainment 8 being 69.5 and the average grade at A-level being a B.

Our school site is well maintained with work on two successful condition improvement fund bids recently being completed. The school boilers have been replaced and heating infra-structure upgraded along with the instillation of over 150 new internal fire doors through most parts of the buildings. This academic year the Science department were successful in securing a £100,000 grant from the Wolfson Foundation and work to fully refurnish two Science laboratories is currently underway.

About Us

Being a teacher, student, or a member of support staff at the KGGS is hard work but also very rewarding. Staff and students work well together and achieve some truly outstanding results. Classrooms are calm and purposeful, with staff and students making the most of the excellent working relationships. Teachers can expect deadlines to be regularly met and the work completed to a very high standard whilst student behaviour is excellent. Students expect to be academically successful, with most of our students staying with us for their A-level studies and the majority then

progressing onto university whilst others take up places on sought-after apprenticeships or vocational courses.

A manageable work-life balance is important to us and each year staff complete a well-being questionnaire which is benchmarked with staff from other schools nationally and this then helps us as a school to identify areas of our practice that need addressing.

For this reason we continually review and update our practices and policies which has resulted in:

- Lesson visits as part of our whole school QA programme rather than high stake lesson observations
- Clear curriculum maps for every subject
- Subject based schemes of learning developed by our staff for our students
- Manageable marking and feedback policies specific to departments
- Three data collection points each year with no long-written student reports
- Flexible working practices for parent consultation evenings
- High quality, healthy and nutritious food for all staff and students
- Fully supportive governors invested in KGGS
