

JOB DESCRIPTION: PE INSTRUCTOR

Reporting to: Head of PE

Job Purpose: Working within a team of PE teachers to delivery high quality PE practical classes during the school day, extra curricular activities, clubs, fixtures and events in the local area both during and after school.

For the successful applicant's area of expertise and in many other activities, they will be responsible for leading the coaching sessions.

Key Responsibilities

General:

- Deliver high quality PE and school sports and extra curricular sports.
- Deliver coaching sessions in area of expertise ensuring well structured and interactive sessions are delivered to a high standard.
- Provide students with effective feedback and monitor progress.
- Demonstrate ethical values, positive relationships and attidues towards staff, students, parents, governors and the wider community.
- Deliver enrichment clubs and activities at lunch times and after school.
- Developing and leading school sports teams.
- Orgnising, preparing for and participating in school sport competitions.
- Orgnising external transport for fixtures and events and driving students to these events.
- Support house competitions, sports days, fixtures and other events to raise the profile of PE and school sport.
- Help to identify and support talented individuals within lessons and develop this through extracurricular activities.
- Help ensure the sporting achievements of the school and its' students are well publicised.
- Assist with the running of and consistency of after school clubs.
- One to one support for pupils with SEN or disabilities within lessons where applicable.
- Assist in organising and running inter and intra sports events.
- Contribute to joint working with other organisations.
- Comprehensive knowledge of health and safety to ensure students are not exposed to unnecessary risk or injury through school sports.
- Complete and maintain appropriate data and administration associated with the role.
- Promote health and well being through physical activity.
- Support equality and diversity in PE and school sports
- Undertaking any other duties that may reasonably be regarded as being commensurate with the grade and general purpose of the post.
