<p>All teachers are required to carry out the duties of a schoolteacher as set out in the current School Teachers Pay and Conditions Document. Teachers should also have due regard to the Teacher Standards (2012). Teachers' performance will be assessed against the teacher standards as part of the appraisal process as relevant to their role in the school.</p> <p>Teaching:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Plan and teach well-structured lessons to assigned classes, following the school's plans, curriculum and schemes of work Assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievements of pupils, making accurate and productive use of assessment Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of pupils Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge Participate in arrangements for preparing pupils for external tests <p>Whole-school organisation, strategy and development:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Contribute to the development, implementation and evaluation of the school's policies, practices and procedures, so as to support the school's Christian values and vision Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school Work with others on curriculum and pupil development to secure co-ordinated outcomes Lead a subject as directed by the senior leadership team. Provide cover, in the unforeseen circumstance that another teacher is unable to teach Add any other duties of particular relevance to your school. Promote the safety and wellbeing of pupils Maintain good order and discipline among pupils, managing behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment. To carry out any other duties at the reasonable request of the headteacher or member of the senior leadership team. <p>Professional development:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take part in the school's appraisal procedures Be proactive in seeking opportunities for CPD Take part in further training and development in order to improve own teaching Where appropriate, take part in the appraisal and professional development of others Lead professional development for colleagues as appropriate. <p>Communication:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Communicate effectively with pupils, parents and carers Working with colleagues and other relevant professionals Collaborate and work with colleagues and other relevant professionals within and beyond the school Develop effective professional relationships with colleagues 	

Personal and professional conduct:
