Welcome to our schools and thank you for showing interest in the above post. The post is most suitable for a Key Stage 2 teacher with at least one year of experience and will be located at St Thomas' in the first instance. The purpose of this letter is to tell you about our schools, their aims and the role of the teacher in our school Federation.

St Thomas' and St Clement and St James CE Primary Schools have recently federated. As a result, I am executive head at both schools and Adrian Jones, Ellie Dowthwaite and Ian McDonald are heads of school. There are many benefits to this partnership; including shared professional development, greater senior leadership expertise and the additional career development opportunities that a larger organization offers. The leadership team was judged outstanding in our last Ofsted at St Thomas'

St Clement and St James is located near Holland Park in a peaceful, attractive area of Notting Hill. It has a small village school feel and a wonderful new edible garden. The school is deceptively large inside and has recently been refurbished. We also have an arts centre, which gives both schools access to a range of professional artists who will train staff in a range of media including ceramics and printing.

St Thomas' CE Primary School is situated near to the Portobello Road (with many shops, market stalls and eating places). We are very pleased to have moved into a lovely new school in January 2009. When people visit our school they frequently comment on our calm and beautiful learning environment, which is extremely well-resourced.

Both schools are one-form entry and have nursery classes. We aim to serve our local community, which is culturally and socially diverse. Around half of the children come from families living on income support. Many of our children speak English as an additional language; the largest minority language being Arabic. We have children from the Caribbean, Africa, Asia, the Middle East, Europe and many other countries. We value enormously the richness of experience that all our children bring with them and celebrate this regularly throughout the school year.

At both schools we benefit from strong links with our local churches nearby. Although we welcome children from all faiths, our mission statements are very much rooted in our Christian values.

Our aim is to raise standards of achievement for all our children, ensuring that they are articulate, confident and able to flourish. We know this doesn't happen without the support of parents and a

great staff team. We recognise the worth of the staff team working together, aiming to promote positive learning environments with the highest expectations for all.

Our main focus is the development of a truly enriching and exciting curriculum that prepares children for the future. We believe that children are motivated to learn through meaningful experiences. We take a topic based approach and value trips and visits - believing that these create engagement in learning and build children's knowledge. We also believe that the arts have an important part to play in enhancing the curriculum and seek to use music, dance, drama and art to enrich children's learning.

We are looking for a Key Stage 2 teacher for St Thomas' in the first instance. We need a teacher who can demonstrate a clear understanding of how children learn and who will enjoy working as part of a dedicated, highly motivated and supportive team to secure the best possible outcomes for children. You will be working with experienced teachers who will work alongside you to develop your professional skills. We very much encourage innovation, creativity and purposeful, exciting learning. We want to work with someone who has leadership potential, who aspires to be the best and is willing to work hard and develop his or her expertise. If you believe you have these qualities, then we welcome your application.

You are welcome and very much encouraged to visit St Thomas' which will give you an opportunity to learn more about the job and see just how fantastic it is to work with us.

The recruitment process includes several stages. During shortlisting, candidates will be judged by the level to which they fulfill the person specification criteria in their application. In their supporting statement candidates should make sure they address the person specification. Please note, applications will only be considered if they include a fully completed application form - CVs are not acceptable alternatives. When completing the application form, candidates should give a full work history and account for any gaps in employment. Applications can be sent either by email or post.

When selecting referees, candidates must give details of two referees, the first of which must be the current or most recent employer, or the Head teacher. Candidates need to be sure that their referees are willing and able to provide a reference in a timely manner. If shortlisted, candidates should be aware references may be taken up before interview and the content of the reference could be discussed at interview. In addition, we may approach previous employers who have not been identified by candidates as a referee and we may seek further information from referees who have supplied a reference. Previous employers will be asked whether there are any concerns about your suitability to work with children. These crucial steps are part of our safer recruitment process and reflect our safeguarding policy.

The closing date for applications is Monday 21st June at 12 noon. Interviews will be held later in the week of the 21st June.
