# Primary Teacher Specialising in SEN. Grade: Qualified Teachers' Pay Scale.

#### **Core Purpose**

We are seeking a highly skilled colleague who will be dynamic and committed to the department and the school. Crucially the post holder must have a commitment to comprehensive all-through education and training. They will believe passionately in the entitlement of individuals of all ages to learning.

#### Main Responsibilities

The responsibilities of this role could vary as a result of new legislation, changes in technology or policy changes. This job description is not an exhaustive list of tasks of the role.

#### **Specialist Teaching and Learning Responsibilities**

- Working with the SENCo establishing and managing a 'nurture base' Hub environment
- Delivering/planning intervention to meet the need of children with EHCPs/high levels of SEND need
- Supporting staff to develop their expertise in meeting SEND need across all classrooms.
- Teaching across the curriculum, ensuring differentiation provides appropriately high challenge for the pupil range.
- To plan for and supervise the work of associated teaching assistants, facilitating their professional development and establishing an effective classroom team.
- To undertake the role of class teacher, establishing positive relationships with pupils, tracking, reviewing and recording their progress in line with school policy.
- To produce progress and end of year reports.
- To actively participate in annual review meetings for EHCP students.
- To support the care and medical needs of all pupils.
- To follow school policy and positively support behaviour by training to use and applying Team Teach principles of de-escalation and physical intervention.
- To follow all school policies with regards to teaching, learning and assessment.
- To use ICT school systems to plan and assess pupils learning.
- To use ICT to enhance pupil learning.
- To be willing to undertake CPD training as required to execute their role of classroom teacher and subject leader.
- To support pupils in developing a range of strategies for managing their emotions and communicating them effectively.
- To support established behaviour policies, systems and processes to anticipate and manage behaviour constructively and calmly, promoting selfcontrol and independence and recognising steps of progress.
- To formulate annual review reports and other progress reports for individual pupils as required, in line with school policy.
- To use self-evaluation processes to raise standards, contributing to school improvement processes and composing reports as required.
- To undertake duties as may reasonably be required by the Head Teacher.

#### Additionally, STPCD requires all teachers to be involved in:

- Advising and co-operating with the headteacher and other teachers on the preparation and development of courses of study, teaching materials, teaching programmes, methods of teaching and assessment and pastoral arrangements
- Taking any such part as may be required in the review, development and management of activities relating to the curriculum, organisation and pastoral functions of the school

#### Management of Physical Resources

- Create and maintain a carefully considered physical environment within the SEN areas and classrooms, including displays of student work; group or independent learning areas; specialist 1:1 space.
- Be responsible for the use of a delegated budget to provide learning resources and other equipment necessary for the effective operation of the SEND teaching team.

#### Support to Children, Families and Communities

- To formulate student support plans (SSPs) in partnership with parents, pupils and other professionals and other individual programmes to address core barriers to learning and enable progress, well-being and independence.
- To develop effective, collaborative working partnerships with parents/carers, colleagues, other agencies and professionals to enable pupils to make progress.
- To recognise that communication is a two-way process and encourage parents and carers to participate in discussions about the progress, development and wellbeing of children and young people.
- To recognise and respect the contributions that colleagues, parents/carers can make to the development and wellbeing of children and young people and to raising their levels of attainment.
- To work collaboratively with other staff, schools and agencies to ensure a coordinated approach to supporting pupils' wellbeing and progress and personalised learning pathways.
- To communicate effectively with children, young people and colleagues.
- To communicate effectively with parents/carers, conveying timely and relevant information about pupils' progress and wellbeing.

#### **Other Duties**

- To attend mandatory training courses, e.g., Child Protection, Equal Opportunities and Health and Safety related courses.
- To promote and celebrate an approach of equality, diversity and inclusion for all colleagues, students and external stakeholders.
- Responsible for the health and safety of themselves and others.
- Responsible for the safeguarding of and promotion of wellbeing for both children and colleagues.
- To be a team player and contribute towards the vision, culture and ethos of the Trust.
- From time to time you may be required to carry out other duties commensurate with the role.
