Teaching and Learning

To teach Product Design at Key Stage 3 and 4.

- To teach Art at Key Stage 3.
- Set high expectations so that all students are inspired, motivated and challenged to reach their full potential, and in doing so meet their progress and attainment targets.
- Plan and teach well-structured, scaffolded lessons that support and challenge all students, including those who are disadvantaged, SEND and EAL, to access the key learning.
- Reflect on the effectiveness of your teaching and adapt accordingly to ensure all students are learning effectively in your lessons.
- Use assessment to inform teaching and learning, identify areas for intervention and provide feedback to students, staff and families in order to promote progress and outcomes.
- Promote and celebrate student achievement, including the use of rewards.
- Manage behaviour effectively in line with the school behaviour policy.
- To establish a purposeful learning environment where diversity is valued and where students feel safe, secure and confident.

Curriculum and assessment

- Contribute to a rigorous and inspirational, knowledge rich curriculum.
- Participate in collaborative planning and curriculum development, including the sharing of resources and best practice within the department.
- Engage with an evidence and research-based approach to curriculum development.
- To contribute to the curriculum to ensure that it reflects our diverse student body and meets the needs of all students including SEND and EAL students.
- Work with the head of department to ensure that exam courses are planned in line with exam specifications.
- Monitor student progress through formative and summative assessment. Use this to identify underperformance, plan appropriate support and achieve excellent outcomes for all the students you teach.

- Keep up to date with developments in pedagogy, research and teaching practice relevant to your subject area.

- Attend specific Design and Technology teaching CPD and keep up to date with subject specific developments.
- Take part in instructional coaching and coach colleagues as appropriate.
