THE ROLE

To manage a help desk for pupils to gain support and access to appointments throughout the school day. Supporting high quality administrative provision and assisting in delivering health and welfare care under the guidance of the PA to the Executive Principal and Head of School. To be the Lead First Aider across the school.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide first aid/health support for pupils when at the help desk.
- Promptly report first aids and sickness using school IT systems.
- Ensure all first aid equipment is fully stocked.
- Support prompt attendance in lessons by effectively triaging pupils with first aid/health and welfare needs including those with special needs, ensuring their safety and access to learning activities
- Provide general support for pupils coming to the Help Desk and signpost to the relevant pastoral team/tutor.
- Use school IT systems appropriately to record pupils arriving late/leaving school site for appointments.
- Establishing good relationships with parents and carers when contacting on the telephone, acting professionally at all times.

- Provide administrative support to the PA to the Executive Principal and Head of School regarding general welfare paperwork.
- Promote positive values and attitudes, good student behaviour and health and safety, dealing promptly with conflict and incidents in line with established policy and encourage students to take responsibility for their own behaviour.
- Dealing with any immediate problems or emergencies according to the school's policies and procedures.

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

 To undertake as required other duties and responsibilities relevant to the job or the seniority of the post as directed by the Principal
