KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work with the Head of English to deliver reading programmes and support for identified pupils
- Engage with school attainment data to ensure pupils are with low reading abilities are identified and provide a programme of support
- Ensure disadvantaged pupils have good access to the provision
- Ensure our library has a wide range of literature that id diverse and reflects the wider world.
- Ensure there is a range of literature and of good quality
- Manage the day to day operation of the School Library.
- Identify and order the Library resources in association with Heads of Department within the School.
- Maintain the Library Catalogue and provide appropriate training and support.
- Administer Library bookings
- Liaise with outside agencies over relevant out of School activities e.g. library and author visits.
- Undertake preparation, maintenance and organisation of library materials
- Maintain and create displays and promote a positive learning environment within the Library
- Provide information for teaching staff on matters pertaining to library support for the school curriculum
- Supervise and oversee study in the library, general discipline and induction into the use of the Library's facilities
- Undertake in-service training and other training as appropriate to ensure continuous professional development and remain up to date
- Assist in preparation of the library for meetings, etc
