## **Job Description**

## **Professional responsibilities**

- To plan for and support the development of a group of Year 1 pupils within the classroom ensuring that they have access to a broad and rich and appropriate curriculum.
- To facilitate and monitor the overall progress and development of EYFS pupils and year1 pupils
- Encourage pupils' motivation and enthusiasm, fostering positive attitudes to learning and high standards of behaviour.
- To foster a positive and enabling learning environment and educational experience which provides pupils with the opportunity to thrive
- To implement the changes to the EYFS curriculum To support and contribute to the schools' responsibility for safeguarding children
- Attend staff meetings, Teacher Education Days, parents' evenings, and any other function or meeting as required
- To manage the transition process for Year 1 pupils to make sure that they are fully supported in their learning
- To be an integral part of the development of the school upholding the school values
- Work as part of a team maintaining high standards of provision

- Working with others to plan and coordinate work both indoors and outdoors
