Applicants are required to have an honours degree (2:2 or above) in a relevant subject to the one they wish to teach, awarded by a UK university or an overseas award recognised as equivalent by UK ENIC. The degree must have a minimum 50% content of the subject in which you are applying. GCSE (or iGCSE) English Language at Grade 4 (Grade C) or above and GCSE Mathematics at Grade 4 or above (Grade C) are also pre-requisites for teacher training. N.B. Equivalency tests in lieu of GCSE Maths and English Language will only be considered in exceptional circumstances.

For the salaried route, 3 year career experience is preferred. Generous bursaries or scholarships are available in shortage subjects via the PGCE route. More information about the different routes can be provided on request.
