JOB DESCRIPTION

MPS – SCIENCE TEACHER AND HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE

- 1 To teach all strands of Science and Health and Social care and build a curriculum that encompasses Key Stage 3 and 4.
- 2 To teach, sustain and develop a positive teaching and learning environment with an emphasis on high expectations.
- 3 To have a secure knowledge of the Science and Health and Social care, foster and maintain students' interest in the subject and address misunderstandings.
- 4 To monitor the progress of the pupils through keeping accurate records of attendance, class work and homework, based on regular marking of pupils' work following departmental, school and exam board policies.
- 5 To contribute to a Science curriculum and develop the Health and Social care curriculum and schemes of work to a high standard.
- 6 To impart knowledge and develop understanding through effective use of lesson time.
- 7 To know when and how to differentiate appropriately using approaches which enable students to be taught effectively.
- 8 To know and understand how to assess the relevant subject and curriculum area including statutory assessment requirements.
- 9 To have high expectations of behaviour and establish a framework for discipline with a range of strategies using praise, sanction and rewards consistently and fairly.
- 10 To be a pro-active member of the department team and, as such, work within that team on developments and projects as required, enhance career and professional development and departmental development.
- 11 To provide written reports for internal use and external use as required by the school's annual reporting cycle to parents.

- 12 To liaise with any specialist support teacher with pupils either within or outside of the group e.g. Special Needs and EAL, but to remain accountable for the progress of those pupils.
- 13 To be accountable for pupil's attainment, progress and outcomes.
- 14 To be a member of the School's Pastoral team.
- 15 To make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of school.
- 16 To give full support to the School's Equal Opportunities Policy.
- 17 To be bound by the general teachers' duties as laid down in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions document – undertaking such duties as may be reasonably expected – including involvement in extra-curricular activities.

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SELECTION CRITERIA

MPS – SCIENCE AND HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE TEACHER

- 1 To be a graduate and either possess a Science or Health and Social care degree or hold a teaching certificate in Science or Health and Social care.
- 2 To have a sound and developing knowledge of the subject area and be willing to teach across the age and ability range.
- 3 A genuine passion for teaching Science and Health and Social care.
- 4 The ability to be an outstanding Science and Health and Social care teacher.
- 5 To be aware of the particular needs of teaching in an all Girls' school.
- 6 To be able to set and maintain high expectations of work and behaviour.
- 7 To have some understanding of Equal Opportunities issues and a determination to apply the school's Equal Opportunities Policy in all aspects of work as a professional.
- 8 To be able to enhance teaching delivery and learning by the use of ICT.
- 9 To help develop the work and ethos appropriate to the school.
- 10 Desirable – Experience in teaching BTEC level 3 courses at Post-16
