



The Science Faculty at St Bede's is high-achieving and enjoys consistently impressive results.

It is made up of a strong, highly committed team of professionals, who consistently display excellence in their practice and pedagogy. Currently consisting of nine teachers; the Science Faculty at St Bede's is creative and dynamic and embraces the opportunity to reflect upon its practice. All members of the teaching team are involved in the planning and resourcing of the curriculum, share best practice, and contribute to policies. Science examination results are consistently outstanding. Across all sciences, our students consistently make significantly positive progress, placing us among the highest performing schools in the county.

Science is mainly taught in a suite of one specialist classroom and seven modern laboratories on a single floor. Rooms are pleasant to teach in and provide a stimulating learning environment. The Faculty is well-equipped with books and resources and is generously funded.

At Key Stage 3 the Science Curriculum is based around the Exploring Science scheme of work, but with additional content to ensure that our students receive a broad curriculum and are prepared for the demands of the GCSEs. The topics are not designed to restrict a teacher's individuality and all teachers are encouraged to be inventive to meet the needs of the students in their classes and imaginative and creative in the planning of lessons. Careful monitoring of student progress takes place. All students are set targets and they are informed of their progress regularly. The department prides itself on the high quality of its pupil feedback. Students are set according to ability from Year 8 onwards.

The Key Stage 4 Curriculum is based on the AQA specification. The Science Team have carefully structured the curriculum to facilitate the sharing of resources and the successful monitoring of student progress.
