Our dedicated staff are committed to 'Changing children's lives, building better futures'.

We achieve this through a consistent approach towards understanding the needs and motivations of children and young people ('CYP'); and through recognising and celebrating their efforts and achievements.

As a non-maintained special school, West Kirby School and College caters for CYP, aged 5-19 years, with a range of complex special educational needs and disabilities ('SEND'). We support pupils with social and communication difficulties; Autistic Spectrum Condition; ADHD; PDA; related learning and emotional, sensory and motor needs, across a range of cognitive abilities.

Our aim is for young people to leave West Kirby School and College with academic accreditations, together with developed social, emotional and communication skills. We achieve this through a structured, supportive learning environment with an individualised curriculum, based on relevant and meaningful learning, where CYP make aspirational progress from individual starting points.

In tandem with this, we promote the development of **life skills**, **personal wellbeing** and **good mental health** through structured activities and adventures, both in and outside school. These enrich learning opportunities and give pupils an appreciation of the wider world, of community and charitable partnerships.

Our broad approach enables pupils to experience and develop career pathways which, we hope, will lead them towards a successful adult life. Due to its location to the North West of the Wirral peninsula, West Kirby is able to offer a wide range of opportunities for community relationships, sports, water recreation and natural history. Liverpool and Chester with their wealth of art, culture and history are within easy reach.

The school is close to the centre of West Kirby village and is 200m from the nearest beach and local marine lake.

Job Description – Science and Animal Care Teacher

Summary of The Role:

Under the direction of the Headteacher, carry out the professional duties of a teacher as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document.

Raise standards of student attainment and achievement within Science and monitor, support and track student progress.

Deliver Science up to GCSE and A Level.

Working with our Animal Care Technician, teach children who are keen to work with animals about care and husbandry of a range of creatures, many of which we have based on site.

Lead the development of Science across the School.

Main Duties & Responsibilities:

Teaching Responsibilities:

- Promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young persons;
- Ensure Health & Safety Policies and Procedures are promoted through good working practices within the department;
- WKS recognises the importance of CPD and is committed towards all staff having access to appropriate training in line with appraisal objectives and the School Development Plan;
- To teach Science to groups of students of all abilities across Years 7 –
 11 and Post 16;
- To ensure that all lessons are planned with clear aims and objectives;
- To ensure that all lessons are delivered in line with the departmental schemes of work and school policies;
- To differentiate work according to individual pupil needs;
- To encourage all students to be actively engaged in their own learning and in reviewing their progress against targets;
- To ensure that all the students are known by name and that the classroom atmosphere is positive at all times;

- To encourage and foster intellectual curiosity;

- To set appropriate tasks and challenges for homework accordingly to the published timetable and ensure that it is regularly marked with constructive feedback;
- To keep careful records of student progress in line with departmental and school policy;
- To ensure that there is a high standard of display work the classroom, which is changed frequently;
- · To keep work areas tidy and well organised;
- · To attend scheduled meetings in the school;
- To work with colleagues to formulate plans which have coherence and relevance to the needs of the individual students and to the aims and objectives of WKS.

- To ensure the maintenance of accurate and up-to-date information on all classes taught;

 Produce reports for the school on assessments data, including examination data.

Animal Care:

- Support the Animal Care Technician with the following:
- Ensure the general high standards of welfare for all animals on site;
- Maintain a high degree of cleanliness throughout the site;
- Ensure thorough and accurate record keeping of all animals on site, including the recording of any information related to their care and husbandry:
- Support the selection, procurement and sourcing of new animals for the site as and when required;
- Ensure all animal enclosures are appropriately prepared to receive new animals and are regularly cleaned and maintained to a very high standard;
- Ensure all animals have access to food and water at appropriate intervals for their size, species and type;
- Ensure animals are kept in optimum conditions for their type and species so that they may thrive (light, temperature, humidity, ventialiation and any other factors);
- Ensure all animals' health is monitored through an appropriate cycle of checks;
- Ensure that any sick or injured animals receive the appropriate care they need in a timely way;
- Ensure the safe storage of any medicines or hazardous materials on site:
- Ensure the safe storage and disposal of any waste materials on site;
- Ensure supplies of food, water, and bedding, and other stocks and items are ordered and maintaned; managining the inventory appropriately;
- Ensure that all deceased animals are removed from site and disposed of in an appropriate way;
- Ensure that all adminisatrative duties including checks and documents are completed to the required level of accuracy and within deadlines;
- Ensure that a library of care sheets in maintained and updated (when required) to clearly and accurately outline and describe the needs and animal husbandry routines for each species and type of animal on site;
- Ensure all relevant school polcies and risk assessments are adhered to, and input into their review and creation;
- Maintain and keep up to date own knowledge and skills to ensure the best care for animals on site.

Pastoral Responsibilities:

- To ensure effective communication and consultation with parents and carers of students;
- To act as a Form Tutor and carry out all of the responsibilities linked with that role;
