ABOUT BEST:

Bedfordshire Schools Trust (BEST) comprises ten flourishing academies and five nurseries delivering first choice education, from Early Years to Advanced Level study. Our vision is 'to grow the BEST in everyone.' We believe in the importance of high expectations, hard work and the development of a community of schools where each of us strive to 'be the best that we can be.' Our schools work together to add value and compete to continually improve.

PURPOSE OF ROLE:

- To promote excellence within PE in order to encourage and support students in making progress that is in line with, or above expectations.
- To promote and support teaching and learning within PE that aspires to the highest of standards through quality leadership and support.
- To aid the promotion of PE across the trust and offer appropriate guidance and advice on careers, higher and further education.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Across the BEST Academies:

- To participate in the BEST Management, Evaluation and Review programme.
- To lead meetings as scheduled within the calendar and provide feedback to BEST Senior Leadership Group.
- To implement BEST policies and procedures where appropriate.
- To take part in the review of mechanisms within the aims and objectives of BEST.
- To establish a strong and supportive ethos across BEST.
- To ensure that Health and Safety policies and practices, including Risk Assessments, are in line with national requirements and are updated where necessary, therefore to liaise with the BEST Health and Safety representatives.
- To work with and inform Local Governing Bodies and BEST trustees.

Staffing:

- To deputise for the Head of Department in their absence
- To promote teamwork and to motivate staff to ensure effective working relationships.
- To work within the allocated CPD funds and Professional Review processes to ensure that staff development needs are identified and that appropriate specialist programmes are designed to meet such needs.
- To organise and participate in regular observations of all teachers using the Academy and/or BEST documentation.
- To undertake Performance Professional Reviews and to act as an appraiser in the Professional Review process with designated staff.
- To participate in the interview process for posts when required.
- To ensure new staff, and staff new to post, are inducted in line with BEST and in-house procedures, providing feedback on progress as appropriate.
- To participate in BEST's ITT and ECT programmes as appropriate.
- To strive to ensure consistency across the department.

Teaching:

- To undertake an appropriate programme of teaching in accordance with the duties of a middle leader.
- To undertake marking and feedback in-line with department policy.
- To maintain the highest standard of expectations in lessons

Specific Duties:

- To be responsible to the Head of PE for student progress and achievement in KS5 & Core games.
- To facilitate the writing, evaluating, monitoring and reviewing of schemes of learning that enhance the teaching of and support student progress in all post 16 PE qualifications.
- To lead development of pedagogy through monitoring, evaluating and supporting learning in lessons. Exemplify good practice in their own classrooms and be open to others observing this.
- To play an active role in supporting the Head of PE to develop effective PR across the department and help facilitate appropriate CPD within the PE.
- To work with the Head of PE, teaching staff, SLT and other agencies in order to take appropriate action in the case of inadequate teaching.
- To maintain an up-to-date database on student progress and monitor identified sub-groups in subject area and across the subject and department.
- To have an overview of the attendance, progress and assessment data for all target groups (EAL, FSM, SEN, Gender, EM, CLA and High Attainers) at KS5 whilst liaising with the SENCO, Head of Department and other relevant staff as appropriate so appropriate interventions and challenges can be made for these students.
- To liaise with the Exams Department and Head of PE to ensure students are correctly entered for appropriate exams and co-ordinate coursework planning, delivery and assessment across the subject area.
- To ensure PE cover work is set to an acceptable standard and work with learning supervisors and support staff in the delivery of this work.
- To keep abreast of new developments in the curriculum and attend regular standardisation meetings and feedback developments to department.
- To work with Middle School Liaison Coordinator and other subject leaders to ensure smooth transition and student progress across the trust.

- To Along with the Head of PE assist with the behaviour of students within the department or Sixth Form and support teachers in the management of student behaviour. This will also involve administering department detentions where appropriate.
- To advise Head of PE in consultation with technicians, on the purchase of equipment and consumables. Liaise with the Senior Technician to ensure of practical work requiring preparation in advance.
- To encourage and help organise, along with Head of PE, opportunities for curriculum enrichment e.g. University Trips, Independent Learning skills trips, etc.
- To liaise with all stakeholders internal and external to the organisation as required, promoting the best interests of BEST at all times.
- To contribute and discuss solutions or interventions during KS5 Progress meetings with Head of Sixth Form.
- To analyse closely with the Head of PE during key examination and assessment periods areas of strengths and areas for improvement.
- To work closely with the Sixth Form team during calendared events (i.e. Induction Days and Open Evenings).
- To plan and lead the Core Games curriculum. Analysing needs of all students and appropriate sport selection, especially for GCSE PE students.
- To review Core Games with Teachers and the PE student council to constantly improve our provision.
