Our Curriculum:

MFL is taught as a discrete subject in Key Stage 3 allowing us to provide our students with a broad foundation of target language and skills prior to them opting for either French or Spanish at GCSE level. With this in mind, our Key Stage 3 curriculum aims to introduce students to a wide range of cultural topics in the target language including: describing yourself and others, free time, school, family and friends, cities and food. At GCSE we follow the AQA syllabus. Students further develop their linguistic ability through

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more in-depth study of holidays, school, technology, sport, international events and festivals, future study and work and the environment. Hereby building on and applying a range of grammatical structures through reading, writing, listening and speaking. We have a number of enrichment opportunities including trips to both France and Spain and links to schools in those countries.

Our Team:

Currently the MFL team comprises of five teaching staff, both French and Spanish specialists. We are a dynamic group of people with a wealth of experience and have all lived and worked abroad. With a passion for languages and culture, we endeavour to make language learning fun and meaningful, incorporating new ideas and styles of teaching such as Dr. Gianfranco Conti's latest teaching strategies.
