Our hub offers a nurturing and structured environment where pupils receive tailored support to help them thrive both academically and emotionally. Children access learning within the hub for a substantial part of the week, alongside planned integration opportunities in their mainstream classrooms.

The successful candidate will:

- Deliver high-quality teaching and learning tailored to individual needs.
- Implement strategies that promote emotional regulation, social communication, and positive relationships.
- Work closely with staff, parents, and external agencies to ensure a consistent and supportive approach.
- Contribute to the development of bespoke curriculum plans and interventions.
- Maintain accurate records and support the review of EHCP targets.

This is an exciting opportunity to make a real difference for children who require specialist support in their early years of education

We are looking for an experienced, dynamic and resilient teacher who has high expectations for all pupils, with direct experience of working with Special Educational needs. The successful candidate will be creative, inspirational and has the ability to make learning purposeful and relevant – helping our children to raise their aspirations and believe in their own abilities to succeed and shine. The ability to communicate clearly and build effective relationships with all involved in a child's education is essential.
