

UFFCULME SCHOOL - GENERAL INFORMATION

Uffculme School is a successful school with a long and proven track-record of providing high quality education for children and young people with a primary diagnosis of ASD. We are located on three sites in the Moseley / Kings Heath area of Birmingham. Uffculme School offers co-education for children and young people of the ages 4 to 19 years from all parts of the city. Students represent the wide cultural mix that makes up the general population of Birmingham. We are a popular school with a total of 254 students on role over the three sites.

Headteacher, Charlotte Stubbs, joined the school in September 2018. The Chair of Governors, Mr John Garrett, was appointed in July 2019. The Governors are currently recruiting for additional members to support the school. There are vacancies on the Governing Body which has an impact on the capacity to develop the school strategically. The Governing Body commissioned an Audit of Governance in Autumn 2021. Governors will be working with Birmingham School and Governor Services to commit to a development plan in early 2022.

Student and staffing numbers have increased over recent years and continue to do so. We continue to work with the Local Authority to support the strategic development and city-wide capacity for children and young people with Autism. This growth in student numbers has also challenged the school leadership team and staff to vary our curriculum model for more complex learners and to ensure that the curriculum is relevant for all learners at all points in their development. Development of curriculum intent and implementation across the schools was led by the senior leaders over 2020 – 21 and continues to be refined and embedded in practice.
