Job Description

Job Purpose

To support the education, development and inclusion of pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) by working as part of the school's SEND team within the Support Base and mainstream classrooms.

The postholder will support pupils to access a personalised and bespoke curriculum, implement provision identified within Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs). The postholder will help pupils participate fully in school life, achieve their individual outcomes and develop the confidence and skills required for future success.

Duties and responsibilities

- Work as part of the SEND team to support the learning, development and wellbeing of pupils with SEND across the Support Base and mainstream classrooms.
- Support with strategies for communication, sensory regulation, emotional wellbeing and inclusive classroom practice that enable pupils to access learning and make progress.
- Take guidance from teachers, the SENDCo and other professionals to support the needs of identified pupils and support the development of learning, communication, social and independence skills.
- Adapt activities, resources and learning materials to meet the individual needs of pupils with a range of SEND.
- Support the implementation of provision and outcomes identified within pupils' Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs), contributing with guidance to the monitoring and recording of progress towards individual targets.
- Support pupils to access a personalised and bespoke curriculum designed to meet their individual academic, communication, social, emotional and developmental needs.
- Liaise with teachers and other staff to obtain, exchange and record information relating to pupils' progress, development and wellbeing.
- Use information provided by teachers, the SENDCo and external professionals to support the effective delivery of individual support programmes and interventions.
- Support the role of parents and carers in pupils' learning and contribute to meetings where appropriate.



- Build positive and productive working relationships with pupils and colleagues.
- Help to promote pupil independence through the development of learning, social, communication, mobility and self-help skills, recognising and celebrating individual achievements.
- Support pupils with their social, emotional and mental wellbeing, reporting concerns or barriers to learning to the appropriate member of staff.
- Support pupils' emotional regulation and sensory needs through the implementation of agreed strategies, sensory programmes and therapeutic approaches.
- Support pupils with personal care and intimate care needs, including toileting, changing, dressing and hygiene routines, in accordance with the school's Intimate Care Policy, safeguarding procedures, risk assessments and individual care plans.
- Support the implementation of recommendations and programmes provided by external professionals under the direction of the SENDCo and teaching staff.
- Ensure pupils can safely access equipment, resources and all aspects of school life.
- Support pupils during transitions, playtimes, lunchtimes, educational visits and other less structured parts of the school day to promote inclusion, engagement and positive social interaction.
- Assist with group, class and whole-school activities within and beyond the classroom, including educational visits and enrichment opportunities.
- Undertake administrative duties associated with the role, including the preparation of resources, record keeping, photocopying, filing and supporting documentation required for pupil provision.
- Attend and actively participate in training, meetings, reviews and professional development activities associated with both the apprenticeship programme and the role.
- Undertake relevant training and professional development to develop knowledge of SEND, inclusive practice and evidence-informed strategies that support pupils with a range of additional needs.

Line management

- The postholder has no direct line management responsibility for other employees.

Professional Development

- Maintain and develop professional knowledge, skills and expertise to successfully fulfil the requirements of the SEND Teaching Assistant Apprenticeship.
- Participate fully in apprenticeship training, workplace learning, professional development activities and performance review processes.
- Develop knowledge and understanding of a range of special educational needs and disabilities, inclusive practice and evidence-informed approaches to supporting pupils' learning, development and wellbeing.
- Keep up to date with relevant statutory guidance, safeguarding requirements and school policies.

Professional Conduct

- Be an effective role model for pupils, demonstrating high standards of professionalism, conduct and attendance.
- Actively promote and support the aims, values and ethos of Camp Hill Primary School and The Futures Trust.
