On the course you will learn new skills, such as lifeguarding and first aid, as well as gaining RYA qualifications in dinghy and sail boat handling. You can even apply to take part in the world famous "Fastnet" race and crew on Tall Ships.

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

Increasingly, students successfully gain their place at a competitive university by undertaking an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) alongside their A Levels and other qualifications.

The EPQ award is equivalent to an AS Level and is a popular option that you can apply to undertake in Year 12.

You will frame and agree your own topic to research. Supported 1:1 by a mentor, you will receive 30 hours of taught-study skills to prepare you for a further 60 hours of independent research. After this you will submit a dissertation or prepare an artefact with a supporting commentary.

Consistently, almost all Hayesfield students achieve A*-B in this prestigious qualification.

With the more selective universities providing lower offers to students who excel in EPQ, this is a great way of securing a place at the university you want.

Your EPQ will enable you to demonstrate a wider commitment to your subject of choice. When applying for competitive courses such as Medicine, Linguistics, Psychology or Drama an EPQ will give you a competitive edge!

Previous EPQ projects undertaken by Hayesfield students have included:

- The first play performed in the Roper Theatre. Based on the 17th century witch trials, the play was researched, written, directed and produced by one student.
- Analysis of the efficacy of different protein-based treatments for Alzheimer's
- A portfolio of British women's fashion of the 1950s
- Assessment of the impact on local economies of inward Chinese investment in southern Africa
- Stripping and rebuilding a Triumph engine
- Constructing an eco-friendly Summerhouse

Helping you to achieve your ambitions is central to everything we do at Hayesfield.

Our careers programme is designed to help you raise your sights and focus on higher education and apprenticeships beyond Sixth Form. We will help you research and identify the best universities for the subject you want to take. We'll provide advice from former Hayesfield students on securing a place at Oxford and Cambridge as well as share information directly from admission tutors on how to achieve a place at Bristol, Exeter and Birmingham universities.

Tutorial support

We operate an outstanding tutorial support programme. You will be assigned a personal tutor who you can meet every day to discuss everything from current affairs, personal and health issues. They will also be able to help you make decisions on your future plans for university and employment. Tutors will also work with you to set personalised targets for academic improvement.

Our structured and supportive process ensures that your study programme is perfectly matched to your individual attributes and ambitions.

Progression through Sixth Form

All our courses in the Sixth Form require two years of committed study. Internal exams are held in May of Y12 and January & April of Y13. These are used to identify areas in which you are excelling as well as any areas in which you need to improve. You will be offered additional support at a time convenient to you.

For those wishing to apply for medicine, veterinary science, dentistry and all subjects at Oxford and Cambridge, our Bespoke Pathway provides all the tools and support needed to succeed. If you would rather apply for elite courses in other subjects, e.g Maths at Warwick, you may also be encouraged to attend this pathway.

Our Sixth Form has an excellent track record in supporting applications to elite universities and courses – for the last five years, every Hayesfield applicant for medicine has secured a place.

Aspire pathway

This exciting and academically focused pathway is structured to prepare you for entry to one of the UK's top universities. You can combine rigorous academic study with the flexibility of an Extended Project Qualification or Core Maths. A study skills programme will support your learning and supervised study periods are structured to maintain your academic focus. You can also get involved in enrichment opportunities to develop your personal skills.

We work closely with local universities in Bath and Bristol to provide you with access to taster courses. Our tutors will prepare you for the university application process by sign-posting programmes such as On Track to Bath and Access to Bristol.

Inspire pathway

If you have the desire to study at a higher level but need a little additional support to make the transition from GCSE, this pathway is right for you. We recommend taking 2 A Levels plus a vocational course while acquiring broader skills through schemes such as the UWE Heading Higher Passport.

We will provide extensive support to prepare you for your post-18 destinations. University visits and visiting speakers help guide your higher education course selection and careers lectures in the Spring Term provide a platform to network with potential employers. You will also receive quality information about higher apprenticeships as an alternative to university.

This pathway will help prepare you for higher education application or a higher apprenticeship.



Explore pathway

This pathway allows you to choose vocational subjects with a greater focus on practical application and coursework. Featuring employability workshops, you will build on your practical skills and strengths, and a wide range of professional work placements will provide valuable employer contacts and networking.

All vocational courses are Level 3 (A Level equivalent) which means you can progress to study at university or undertake career-development apprenticeships.

This pathway also provides you with the opportunity to try out a number of vocational routes in order to make an informed choice about which is the right one to pursue post-18.

Endeavour pathway

This pathway allows you to develop vocational learning though a range of Level 3 Applied Generals and Cambridge Technicals. With this flexible pathway you can combine the study of a single area in depth, for example qualifications such as Childcare and Health and Social Care alongside a single award in another vocational area or suitable A Level.

You will have access to at least two work placements during your vocational course where you will gain invaluable information about accessing apprenticeships. If you wish to go on to higher education you will be supported to make applications for a foundation degree.

We consider applications from students without a Grade 4 in English or Maths on a case by case basis and offer GCSE re-sit groups where appropriate.
