Job Purpose:	To work under the overall direction of the SENDCo and class teacher, to provide routine support to the teacher in the care of pupils and management of the classroom. You will specifically be required to provide behaviour, language and learning support to particular children who require assistance to overcome their barriers to learning. To ensure the safeguarding, and promote the welfare, of all the children in the school community.

<u>Key Accountabilities</u> Support Learning	<u>Key Tasks</u> To: • Use routine supervision and care skills to support a specific pupils with SEND, to ensure their safety and well-being in school • Support specific pupils by assisting in day-to-day learning through in-class support, both independent and small group work • Support specific pupils by assisting in the development of a co-ordinated approach between home and school to develop self-care skills and independence • Encourage the pupils to interact with others and engage in activities led by the teacher • Evaluate and record interventions and pupil outcomes as directed by the class teacher/SENDCo • Accompany teaching staff and pupils on visits, trips and out of school activities as required
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	• Work as part of a team to ensure that the well-being, behaviour and personal development of pupils enhance their learning opportunities and life skills
Support teaching	To: • Assist in the delivery of structured support to the identified pupils in accordance with specific work programmes designed and supervised by the class teacher/SENDCo/external agencies • Assist in the delivery of educational provision for pupils with EHCPs. • Monitor pupil progress and contribute to future planning • Provide support to ensure the pupils achieve learning goals • Provide detailed and regular feedback to teachers and SENDCo on pupils' achievement, progress, problems etc. • Work as part of a team in maintaining classroom organisation and discipline through the implementation of the school's behaviour management strategies
Support the School	Under the overall direction and supervision of the class teacher/SENDCo: • Ensure all pupils have equal access to opportunities to learn and develop • Assist in the preparation and development of agreed curriculum activities/materials • Support the use of ICT in learning activities and develop pupils' competence and independence in its use • Promote the school aims and ethos, maintaining confidentiality inside and outside the workplace • Be aware of and comply with policies and procedures relating to child protection, health and safety, security, confidentiality, and data protection, reporting all concerns to an appropriate person • Attend relevant meetings as required • Participate in training and other learning activities and performance development as appropriate to the needs of the pupils • Undertake any other duties that may be reasonably required by the Head Teacher or SENDCo.
