General Information:

Woodlands School is located in a quiet area of Leatherhead, next to a small recreation ground and wooded area enhancing the feeling of space and of being in the countryside.

Both departments have outside areas designed to challenge pupils with the added benefit of our newly opened EYFS sensory area.

We have a small swimming / hydrotherapy pool which is timetabled for use by all classes. Older and more competent swimmers have their lessons at a local leisure centre.

Woodlands draws pupils widely from across Surrey.

Multi Disciplinary Working:

We have a strong multi professional team approach in partnership with Central Surrey Health who provide our nursing and therapy support. Clinics such as orthotics, wheelchair and paediatricians appointments are held at the school.

The outstanding work of our nursing and therapy team was recognised by their achievement of the CSH Team of the Year Award in July 2015 together with 2 individual awards for excellence.

They have also set up a lunchtime running club for pupils to promote fitness.

Multi professional team meetings are held with parents prior to any child joining the school.











Accessing the local community:

We have strong links with the local community and currently our 3 minibuses and caddy are well used in transporting groups to a range of activities in the local area.

Leatherhead town centre is about 20 minutes walk from school and the route provides good opportunities for practicing road safety skills.

Friends of Woodlands:

An active Friends of Woodlands group organises events and raises money to support the school.

We hold the Leading Partnership with Parents Award (LPPA) and run coffee mornings each half term to promote this. Our parent support advisor is proactive in her work with parents and families.

SPAN:

We are active members of SPAN, (Surrey's <u>SLD</u>, <u>PMLD</u>, <u>ASD</u>, <u>Network</u>) which facilitates training, professional debate and opportunities for cross school moderation and support.

Enhancing our offer:

Our pupils participate in the Surrey Special Schools' Ski Trip, Special Schools' Prom and Sports Events to broaden their experiences.

After School Offer:

After school clubs provide extra-curricular opportunities and informal time with friends.





Music Therapy:

Music Therapy is provided to identified individuals and small groups through Key Changes.

Vocational Learning:

Long standing links with Dorking and Leatherhead Gymnastics Club, RDA, Freewheelers Theatre Company, Local Leisure Centres and Merrist Wood college provide stimulating and realistic opportunities for vocational learning.

Our Signing Choir:

Our signing choir is growing in confidence and perform at school assemblies and fairs.

Creative Arts:

We have strong links with theatre and music groups who visit the school and encourage all of our pupils and staff to participate in the performance.

These give staff and pupils the confidence to produce Christmas performances which are increasingly ambitious and professional as well as being great fun.



As appropriate, training is also provided in Makaton, MAPA, MSI, pool safety, TEACHH and PODD. 
