## Summary

To support students in achieving their potential. To lead subject sessions aimed at reteaching content that is not yet secure for identified underachieving students. To help develop students' confidence and fulfil their potential within the given subject.

## Outline of responsibilities and tasks

- 1. Plan and deliver a series of tutorial sessions in the specialist subject area that enhances the learning of identified students by working with them in small groups outside formally timetabled classes.
- 2. Work with relevant school staff to agree the content of the tutorial sessions for the identified students.
- 3. Monitor the attendance of the identified students in the support sessions.
- 4. Regularly liaise with relevant subject staff regarding the progress of the identified students.
- 5. Where appropriate, to liaise with parents/carers to report on student progress.

Staff will be expected to comply with any reasonable request from a manager to undertake work of a similar level that is not specified in this job description.
