SPORTS and TEACHING ASSISTANT

Purpose of the job

- To deliver to the sites of Corpus Christi Primary School high quality PE and school sport within and beyond the curriculum.
- To promote PE, school sport and physical activity to raise attainment.
- To support colleagues in the delivery of collaborative teaching and learning within and beyond the curriculum.
- To work under the supervision of teachers and senior leaders to raise the learning and attainment of pupils while also promoting their independence, self esteem and social inclusion.

Duties and Responsibilities.

- 1. To develop and deliver a range of high quality support and physical activity opportunities to young people in an engaging and progressive manner in the schools wraparound care.
- 2. To broaden the range of sports and activities on offer to children during lunch, wraparound care and in class.
- 3. To promote physical activity and healthy lifestyle children with a view to lifelong physical activity.
- 4. To lead the delivery of sport in the after-school wraparound care.
- 5. To attend relevant training courses to facilitate continued professional development and to use this knowledge to contribute to improving the quality of delivery.
- 6. To attend internal and external meetings as and when required.
- 7. To undertake other duties appropriate to the grade and character of the work as directed.
- 8. To promote, support and facilitate inclusion by encouraging participation of all pupils in learning and extracurricular activities.
- 9. To demonstrate effective behaviour management strategies consistently in line with the school's policy and procedures.
- 10. To support students with emotional, social and mental health and help develop their skills.
- 11. Undertake other duties from time to time as the Headteacher requires.
- 12. To have regard at all times for the welfare, health and safety of the children under supervision.

Safeguarding

• Everyone who works at Corpus Christi Primary School has the responsibility for promoting the safeguarding and welfare of children.

Commitment To Safeguarding Children

- To ensure awareness of school policy and procedures re Child Protection.
- To become aware of the signs and symptoms of abuse by attending relevant courses.
