Thank you for your interest in joining our Student Support team as a Student Support Worker at Mangotsfield School. This is an exciting opportunity for you to be part of the dynamic and vibrant wider Mangotsfield community, where every member of the teaching and support staff play their part. We know just how important a decision this is for you as well as us and we hope this pack and the selection process enables us both to make the right decision.

Mangotsfield School is a mixed comprehensive school, located opposite Rodway Common in South Gloucestershire, which serves years 7 to 11. The school is oversubscribed in most year groups. It is a diverse and inclusive secondary school, multi-cultural and progressive with over 25 languages spoken and celebrated.

By all the official ways we measure school success Mangotsfield School is a successful and stable school. We secured Ofsted 'Good' in every category in March 2022 and this reflects the dedication and commitment of our incredible staff body to giving our students their "best chances and best choices." We are very proud of the journey the school has been on and the ambitious path it continues to follow.

Our shared vision is to inspire all students to love learning, to embrace challenges, to understand how to show and earn respect and how to contribute towards our community. Our values are central to the student experience everyday and both curricular and extra-curricular programmes are based around these. For example our Challenge Day events promote a love of learning beyond the classroom and encourage students to develop resilience and engagement with the world around them. We take 240 Year 7 students to central Bristol each year for a historical walking tour - and they love it!

Our school population currently totals around 1200 students. Standard year group sizes are 240, although due to popularity we currently have 270 in some year groups. This school has been serving this community for seventy years, it is rooted and belongs to this community. We have several teachers who live locally, we have lots of staff who have sent their children here and we continue to have frequent visits or calls from former students keen to rekindle memories.

You'll have great organisational skills and be able to multitask. You will need to have an NVQ Level 3 Learning Development and Support Services or equivalent or extensive relevant experience in a similar or related post.

Role profile

The postholder will be expected to act as an adult role model and has a responsibility to promote and safeguard the safety and welfare of pupils and students in accordance with CSET/School policies and procedures and any associated guidance. They will need to identify, plan for and provide high quality support for vulnerable students at the school so that they have the opportunity to reach their potential. Part of this role will be to supervise students creating a safe environment, helping them modify behaviour and therefore achieve their full potential. They will develop effective strategies of overcoming barriers to learning for vulnerable students through individual and small group mentoring programmes and to establish and foster effective links with other agencies, as required.

Role Responsibilities

- To work closely with school staff, other professionals, parents and students, to identify and provide a clear, concise and consistent approach in supporting behaviour management.
- To work closely with agencies (when necessary) to facilitate access to specialist support services for students with barriers to learning,
- To support/ observe students in order to plan or monitor interventions,
- To establish, develop and implement individual and small group interventions/programmes to increase engagement and to improve student attendance, develop confidence and self- esteem through a student centred approach, maintaining appropriate records and providing written reports as required.
- To monitor these interventions/programmes and evaluate their impact on student progress, behaviour, confidence, self esteem and attitudes.
- To develop positive relationships with pupils with a particular focus on the most vulnerable, disadvantaged and challenging young people.



Responsibilities continued

- To liaise with families of vulnerable pupils, to help identify personal, community, family and school based issues which are having an adverse effect on individual students and signpost families to other sources of support as appropriate.
- To support the Behaviour Lead in monitoring and improving behaviour and identifying child protection concerns.
- To maintain confidential reports and case notes, record care plans and risk assessments in accordance with school guidelines.
- Provide feedback/reports to the Behaviour Lead and the senior leadership team, as required.
- To be first aid trained and part of a team who respond to illness and injury within the school
- To investigate incidents at school, inform parents and support the students involved
- To support with the schools behaviour management system, including RTL supervision and lunchtime duties
- Carry out any other reasonable tasks within job scope

- You will be personable, approachable and a self-starter.
- You will be willing to learn and be interested in developing new skills.
- You'll have great organisational skills and be able to multitask.
