SPECIFIC DUTIES OF THIS POST:

To carry out the professional duties of a teacher as described in the School Teachers Pay and Conditions documents.

These duties include:

Taking responsibility for the safety, welfare, behaviour and education of pupils in the teacher's own class.

Taking responsibility for organising the classroom and the teaching day in such a way that the needs of all children in the class can be met.

Ensuring that the classroom environment has appropriate resources and materials, and is well and attractively organised for children's use.

Designing displays of children's work to communicate the work of the class and to promote high standards.

Assessing and recording the progress of individual children according to school policy. Reporting progress to parents and others as appropriate.

Planning and implementing the curriculum (and recording curriculum provision) according to Goosewell Academy policy and National Curriculum demands. Working alongside other staff in planning so that continuity in learning is promoted throughout the school.

Developing good working relationships with all colleagues including teachers and support staff, and being responsible for the management of teaching assistants' work in the class.

Developing good relationships and open communication with parents and others in the school community.

Taking some additional responsibility for an aspect of school organisation or a curriculum area. This could include, for example playing a part in a working party with other staff, or disseminating relevant information and managing resources and a budget for a particular (but not major) curriculum area.
