The department occupies a suite of three specialist rooms each with its own storage facilities. The department is well equipped with one kiln, ICT facilities including digital cameras and Apple Mac computers.

All students at KS3 are given the opportunity to work with a wide variety of media and techniques. Thus the Art department favours a multi-media approach in all teaching rooms. We are committed to resource based learning and to this end have developed a resource bank of books and have access to the internet. The Art Curriculum Intent and curriculum overview can be seen on our school website.

Art is very popular at GCSE where pupils follow AQA Fine Art course. This comprises of Drawing and Painting, sculpture, Printmaking and mixed media. Each member of staff is able to teach all areas to a more than competent level, with a specialism in one or more areas.

Students are on the whole well motivated and enthusiastic. GCSE results have been very high over the last 10 years making the Art Department one of the most successful in the school. In the last Ofsted report –March 2020, it was high-lighted as a high performing department with a well planned and delivered curriculum.

Pupil work is celebrated and displayed on a regular basis in the department and around the school, and a GCSE Exhibition is held each year and is open to public view. This is a much valued and high point in the school year. This commences with a private viewing for parents and guests and then is opened to primary school children. Our KS3 pupils also visit the exhibition and produce a visual and written response in their sketchbooks.

The Post

We seek an enthusiastic and well motivated art teacher to work in a forward thinking, hard working and excellenceachieving department. Ideally a base in 3-Dimensional, sculpture and Fine art painting would be an advantage but this is by no means essential. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to bring new thoughts and ideas into the department and to demonstrate their knowledge of Art History. It is essential that the successful candidate is able to enthuse and inspire young people to attain the highest standards in Art and Design. We would also like to see if possible some of the candidates own Art work?

Candidates should be able to demonstrate how they will expand the extra-curricular role of Art. The school, and I in particular, is committed to an extensive extra-curricular programme.
